# Food redistribution activity overview

#### What we do

- Collect surplus food from supermarkets and food partners
- Store and sort food safely at local hubs
- Distribute to food banks, pantries, and schools
- Support the setup of new food initiatives
- Enable fair access across the borough

### How it works



Tapestry team manages logistics and operations



Volunteers assist with packing and deliveries



Distribution is based on local need



Includes targeted projects like Pantry Packs

#### Impact to date

- Meals delivered to the community
- Stronger collaboration across local food providers
- Reduced edible food waste
- Greater food security for vulnerable residents

### Pantry Pack Project – goals and delivery

Our Mission:

 Support families with nutritious food during school holidays

Goals:

- Distribute 100 pantry packs per week across Havering
- Engage schools, volunteers, and local food suppliers
- Reduce holiday hunger and food waste

How It Works:

- Food collected, sorted, and packed by volunteers
- Packs delivered to schools and community centres
- Weekly distributions from 22 July to 24 August 2025
